

## Health Screening Questionnaire

Admittance staff to wash hands for 20 seconds with warm water and soap or use an alcohol gel, before and after receiving pupils, parents and guardians through reception areas. Wear disposable facemask as provided by the Trust at all times when carrying out health screening questionnaire. Disposable PPE should be disposed of after each use, double bagged, then stored securely for 72 hours, then throw it away in the regular waste receptacle. Important - remember social distancing is the most effective way of preventing transmission of the virus. Keep a 2-metre distance between you and other people whilst carrying out this task (and under no circumstance should you touch children).

### **Questions that must be asked before allowing admittance into school buildings:**

1. Have you or your child experienced any of the following coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms in the last 14 days?
  - a. high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
  - b. new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
  - c. loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

***Most people with coronavirus have at least one of the above symptoms.***

2. Have you or any member of your household tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
3. Do you know if you have been exposed to anyone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
4. Have you been contacted by an NHS Track & Tracer and been told to isolate within the last 14 days?

**Child arriving with parent or guardian:**

If the answer is **YES** to any of the above questions the pupil/parent or guardian should **NOT** be granted access to the school.

**Child arriving alone:**

If the answer is **YES** to any of the above questions the admitter must call for an assistant who must wear full PPE including disposable gloves, disposable apron, disposable mask and face shield, to take the child to isolation and arrange for a parent or guardian to collect them as soon as possible.
